Title 18 U.S. Code; Section 922(g)(1); - Felon in Possession of a Firearm:  It shall be unlawful for any person who has been convicted in any court of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year to ship, transport or possess any firearm or			
ammunition; or to receive any firearm or ami	nunition.		
Title 18 U.S. Code; Section 922(g)(9); - Prohibited Person in Possession of a Firearm:  It shall be unlawful for any person who has been convicted in any court of a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence to ship, transport or possess any firearm or ammunition; or to receive any firearm or ammunition.  Title 15 M.R.S.A.; Section 393 and 17-A M.R.S.A.; Section 2; - Felon in Possession of Black Powder Device:  Possession and/or use of a black powder device/weapon by any person who has been convicted of a crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year is prohibited pursuant to Maine state law.
